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1. Qualitative Information on Quarterly Consolidated Financial Performance

(1) Qualitative Information Regarding Consolidated Results of Operations

In the first quarter of the current fiscal year, there were some positive signs in the Japanese economy as stock prices recovered and the yen began to weaken. Two causes are demand created by reconstruction activities following the Great East Japan Earthquake and expectations concerning the benefits of economic programs by the newly elected administration in December 2012. However, the operating environment remains difficult because of the European debt crisis, concerns about slowing economic growth in emerging countries and other reasons.

In the nursing care services sector, the National Council on Social Security System Reform, which was formed in 2012 by the Japanese Cabinet, has been holding discussions about the establishment of a sustainable social security system. For medical care and nursing care, one focus of the discussions is how to strengthen the functions of a framework that enables medical and nursing services to be provided an integrated manner within individual regions.

In this environment, there was an increase in the number of residents in the nursing home business and steady growth in the number of customers in the in-home nursing care business. Net sales increased 1.3% from one year earlier to 2,552 million yen, operating income increased 15.4% to 119 million yen and ordinary income increased 14.5% to 100 million yen. However, net income was down 49.5% to 19 million yen because of higher taxes.

Business segment performance was as follows.

1) Nursing home business

Long Life Kyoto Arashiyama was opened in December 2012. As a result, the nursing home business was operating 20 nursing homes with a total of 803 rooms for residents at the end of the first quarter. The central objective in this business is to raise the occupancy ratio by restructuring the operating framework and strengthening sales activities.

Sales decreased 7.7% to 982 million yen and ordinary income decreased 16.4% to 34 million yen.

2) In-home nursing care business

There were 128 services in this business segment as of the end of the first quarter. Major activities include opening new locations to provide services, increasing the utilization rates of existing locations and conducting extensive sales activities for the provision of welfare services for persons with disabilities.

A divestiture within the LONGLIFE Group that took place on November 1, 2012 resulted in the transfer of some business activities from the in-home nursing care business to the nursing care equipment business. As a result, sales decreased 1.7% to 1,303 million yen and ordinary income decreased 71.4% to 5 million yen.

3) Nursing care equipment business

In this business segment, extensive support is provided by nursing care equipment specialists who have much expertise and skill in the nursing care field. The aim is to provide services that assist seniors in living on their own.

A divestiture within the LONGLIFE Group that took place on November 1, 2012 resulted in the transfer of some business activities from the in-home nursing care business to the nursing care equipment business. Sales increased 200.9% to 226 million yen and there was an ordinary income of 9 million yen compared with ordinary loss of 3 million yen one year earlier.

4) Food business

The food business mainly involves the preparation of meals which are served at our 35 nursing homes.

The LONGLIFE Group is making its brand more powerful by focusing on reinforcing operations to serve customers outside the Group. This involves the use of catering and other activities to strengthen business operations.

Sales decreased 84.7% to 8 million yen and ordinary loss was 4 million yen compared with ordinary income of 7 million yen one year earlier.

5) Others

This segment includes the investment business, which is operated by consolidated subsidiary Long Life International Business Investment Co., Ltd. that makes investments in companies in Japan and other countries, and the dispensing pharmacy business, which is operated by consolidated subsidiary Long Life Pharmacy Co., Ltd.

Sales were 31 million yen compared with no sales one year earlier and there was an ordinary loss of 3 million yen (1 million yen one year earlier).

(2) Qualitative Information Regarding Consolidated Financial Position

Total assets were 10,936 million yen at the end of the first quarter, 755 million yen more than at the end of the previous fiscal year.

Current assets increased by 60 million yen to 3,330 million yen. This was primarily attributable to increases of 57 million yen in cash and deposits, 24 million yen in deposits paid and 22 million yen in notes and accounts receivable-trade, and a decrease of 55 million yen in deferred tax assets.

Noncurrent assets increased by 694 million yen to 7,606 million yen. The primary causes were an increase of 676 million yen in property, plant and equipment, and a decrease of 15 million yen in intangible assets.

Current liabilities decreased by 111 million yen to 5,395 million yen. This was mainly caused by increases of 167 million yen in accounts payable-other and 155 million yen in advances received, and decreases of 302 million yen in short-term loans payable and 125 million yen in income taxes payable.

Noncurrent liabilities increased by 875 million yen to 2,961 million yen mainly because of an increase of 870 million yen in long-term loans payable.

Net assets decreased by 9 million yen to 2,579 million yen, and the equity ratio was 23.6% at the end of the first quarter.
